## Lease Updates Due Now!

The 2015-16 school year is coming to a close. Expired lease notices were sent home over the last several weeks. If you did not receive a notice and your lease is expired or you have



changed residences you must contact Greenbriar immediately with an update. Please do not ignore as Greenbriar students must have valid residency information on file.

Families must bring a copy of their current lease showing the expiration date and the page with management signature and a utility bill no later than May 20. Students with expired leases will be withdrawn after this date!

Students will not be assigned a classroom placement until expired leases are updated. As administration plans for the 2016-17 school year, all residency issues must be in place. If you are moving outside of the Greenbriar district please contact the office as soon as possible so we may forward student records.

In addition, all contact/phone numbers must be up to date. In the event of an emergency, office and clinic personnel must be able to contact parents or guardians as soon as possible. 
