Greetings Greenbriar Families,

Welcome back! Teachers and students have been setting up classroom expectations and procedures and building a sense of community. These are critical components for creating a successful school year and ensuring that we complete the academic material necessary to prepare them for the next grade.

Please note our birthday celebration expectations, car pick up/ drop off procedures and classroom visitation procedures. Only store bought items for a child's birthday are accepted, to be given out during lunch time only by parent. Car drop off begins at 8:05am until 8:25am. Students must stay in their cars until a staff member signals release in the "green safety zone." Car pick up begins at 3:25pm. Students dismiss from classrooms at 3:20pm. The line forms at the north side of the building (entrance #2 North). Please stay in your car. Staff will escort children to your car. This allows the flow to move quickly and ensures safety. We encourage parents to visit classrooms, however you must contact the teacher ahead of time for an appropriate time to visit. Classes have assessments and other activities that may change the daily schedule. Visitors must sign in at the office and staff will call the classroom to confirm your visit. We are limiting disruptions as much as possible while providing a safe environment for students and staff.

Thank you to all of our parent and community volunteers and the PTO who helped with getting school up and running. Thanks to 2nd Presbyterian Church and St. Luke's Church, who donated school supplies, free hair cuts, clothes and shoes to our families. We are lucky that all students are prepared for a successful school year.

Our first PTO meeting is <u>Thursday, September 8 at 6:30pm</u> and we invite all parents to attend. This will be a great opportunity to learn all the ways parents can volunteer throughout the school year.

Thank you to those families who attended our Ice Cream Social and our Back to School nights. Parent communication is very important and allows you to be aware of what is happening in the classroom. If you didn't attend the back to school events, contact your child's teacher to set up an appointment. We would also like to send more communication via technology this year. Please be aware that your current status for free or reduced meals from last year will expire the beginning of September. If you receive free or reduced lunch you must fill out a new application for this school year. If you are a new family to Washington Township please list all students in your household on the new application. This year you can go online @ http://cafe'.msdwt.k12.in.us. in English or Spanish.

Paid lunch is \$2.35 per day. If your student has reduced lunch status, the cost is .50 cents per day. If you need assistance, please fill out an application as soon as possible for this school year.

Every student regardless of their income will receive free breakfast at Greenbriar. Please allow your students to start their day with a free breakfast so they may be ready to learn and focus.

Vision and Hearing screening will be Sept. 19-21 for grade levels (except Kindergarten). Students with referrals will be notified of results.

Updated immunizations are due now. Notices will be sent home for non-compliance. Please do not ignore as students without proper immunizations may be kept out of school until proper shots are given. Please bring a copy of new immunizations to the office.

Reminders from the Nurse

- Medication can only be transported by parent;
- DO NOT send a child to school who has vomited within 12 hours of coming to school;
- Any student with a temperature of 100+ may not attend school until fever-free for 24 hours without fever reducing medication;
- Please keep all emergency contact lists current with updated phone numbers;
- Ill students WILL NOT be transported home on a bus. Immediate pickup from the clinic is required;
- Students with asthma/allergies MUST complete required forms with the nurse.

If you have moved recently and have a new address please bring the updated information to the office.


If you are moving outside of the Greenbriar district. contact the office now so we may forward student records.


