Be Prepared for Flu Season!

October through March is flu season. Is the flu a big deal? YES! The flu is more than a common cold. Symptoms last for weeks and can be the biggest contributor to school absences. The CDC recommends everyone aged 6



months and older receive an annual flu vaccination. Flu vaccines are available at physician's offices, workplaces,

pharmacies and retail stores. Many of these accept Medicaid and commercial insurance. Protect yourself, your families and those around you. Let's all do our best to remain "Flu Free".

Reminders from the Nurse

- Medication can only be transported by parent;
- DO NOT send a child to school who has vomited within 12 hours of coming to school;
- Any student with a temperature of 100 or above may not attend school until fever-free for 24 hours without fever reducing medication;
- Please keep all emergency contact lists current with updated phone numbers;
- Ill students WILL NOT be transported home on a bus. Immediate pickup from the clinic is required;
- Children with asthma or food allergies MUST complete required forms with the nurse.

Why is inquiry important in education? An old saying states: "Tell me and I forget, show me and I remember, involve me and I understand."

This is the basis for inquiry-based learning and the Primary Years Programme of the IB. Teachers fill many roles, including the facilitator of learning. Giving children the tools to make connections, solve problems, and ownership over learning creates learners that are problem solvers, are flexible and persevere until they discover answers. Passive learning disappears quickly, but inquiry-based learning sticks with a child for a lifetime, giving them experiences to reflect and build upon. This kind of authentic learning prepares them for our global society and for success in the future. Greenbriar grizzlies are working hard to take ownership of our learning to make positive choices, to seek answers, and ultimately learn how to be effective, curious and efficient learners!
