## **News from the clinic:** May 23 Last Day for Medication Pick Up

To families with medication in the clinic: All medication must be picked up before May 23, the last day of school. Medication not picked up by this date will be discarded.



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Students who receive any immunizations over the summer must bring a copy of the updated shot record to the school. Please get all age appropriate shots before returning to school August 1. Students may be sent home or withdrawn without these required shorts.

If your child is returning to Greenbriar next year, please be proactive in filling out and turning in all paperwork so your child receives the medication and special care they need.

Remember: All asthma, allergy, seizure and diabetic students must have a Medical Plan Of Care on file in the clinic. All forms MUST be signed by a physician. It is parent responsibility to arrange an appointment to return all appropriate forms. Thank you in advance for your prompt attention to this matter.

## Residency Updates Due Now!

The 2018-19 school year is coming to a close. Lease notices were sent home recently requesting all families to visit their school with mortgage papers or leases. A current



utility bill must also be presented as a residency document. An Indiana drivers license with an address matching the home document will also be accepted. Many students are being relocated to a new school next year; these current residency documents are proof of which school your family will attend. Please do not ignore as all students must have updated residency information on file.

Students will not be assigned a classroom until residency is verified. As administration plans for the 2019-2020 school year, all residency issues must be in place. Families must bring these documents no later than May 23 or students will be withdrawn after this date!

If you are moving outside of the Greenbriar district or Washington Township, contact the office as soon as possible so we may forward student records.
